- Each state has different guidelines for executors from another jurisdiction. Get to know your state's requirements or consult an estate expert to help.
- Spouses usually serve on each other's behalf, but naming an alternate or successor is a good idea.
- Choosing someone with specific, relevant expertise is helpful.
- Secure the executor's agreement in advance and discuss the details of the will and distribution. Consider using two people and requiring joint signatures for safety's sake.
